### Tall Weeds & Other Property Maintenance Issues

Do you walk by that same house at the end of your street and wonder—why don't they **EVER** cut their grass??? Well, if you don't know who to call to report a tall grass or other kind of property code violation (junk in the yard, broken downspouts, etc.), we've got the number! **National Inspection Corporation (NIC)** handles all of the City's property code violations, and they can be reached at **(937) 433-7978**. Please keep in mind, however, not all perceived violations are actual violations of the City's Property Maintenance Code. Grass for example - in order for tall grass to violate the ordinance, it must be 8 inches or taller.

### DID YOU KNOW?

The City utilizes an odd/even watering schedule. In order to conserve water, you are asked to water your lawns on even days if you live in an even numbered house and odd days if you live in an odd numbered house. (Example - you live at 201 Main Street, you should water your lawn on June 21, 23, etc.) Help us to conserve water during the hotter months. It's the **"Green"** thing to do!

## ARBOR DAY 2009

The City of Springboro celebrated its annual Arbor Day celebration on Saturday, April 25, by planting a Sweet Gum Tree at E. Milo Beck Park on Lower Springboro Road, in honor of David Grollmus ("Mr. Grollmus"), a former mechanic with the City that passed away last year.
